



Good Afternoon Richard. I'm Bow 0346166. Today I'd like to introduce San Ta Pha Daeng. The San Ta Pha Daeng is place one of sukhothai (Thailand). The San Ta Pha Daeng or Deity Shrine situated to the north of Wat Mahathat. San Ta Pha Daeng assembles a single laterite tower, the topmost part of which has collapsed. Stairs lead up to top of the basement, about 3 meters off the ground. During excavations and restoration in June 1959, fives images of Brahmanical divinities were found, now in the museum. They date from the first half or the middle of the 12<sup>th</sup> century and belong to the Angkor Wat style of Cambodian sculpture. This shrine dates from the same time. Prince Naris, who called the shrine Sala Phra Pradaeng, thought that its name might be related to the Cambodian title *kamraten*.
