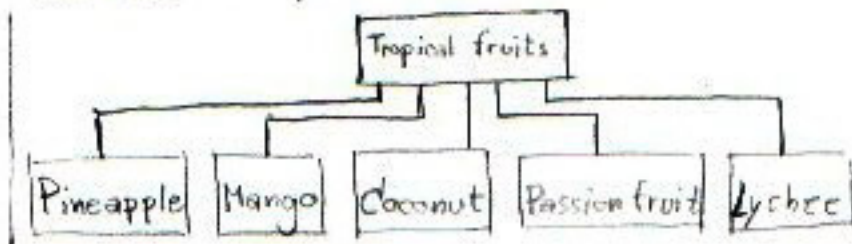
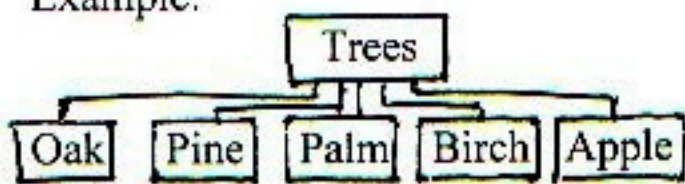
1. Get paper, sticks, string,, paint
